SHOW PREMIERE:

May 13, 1995

OVERVIEW:

This Hollywood-style production, based on the upcoming Warner Bros. movie scheduled to premiere June 16, is completely different from the original Batman Stunt Show that premiered at Six Flags in 1992. The BATMAN™ Forever Stunt Show features a new plot, new heroes (Robin The Boy Wonder and Chase Meridian), new villains (Harvey Two-Face Dent and The Riddler), 30 heart-pounding pyrotechnic explosions, daredevil stunts and the all-new Batmobile™.

IN-PARK LOCATION:

The BATMAN™ Forever Stunt Show will be performed in the BATMAN™ Stunt Show Arena located in the Movie Town section of Six Flags Great Adventure Theme Park.

LENGTH OF SHOW:

20 minutes

THEATER CAPACITY:

The Stunt Show Arena seats 3,200 Guests per show. Five shows will be performed per day through September 5, 1995 (weather

permitting).

SET:

As Guests enter the BATMAN™ Forever Stunt Show Arena, they'll be transported to a redesigned Gotham City. The new set lines the 180-foot stage and features 45-foot, three-story facades of Gotham National Bank, Wayne Manor and Nygmatech Enterprises.

PROPS AND SPECIAL EFFECTS:

The BATMAN™ Forever Stunt Show utilizes a combination of live action, state-of-the-art pyrotechnics, sound, lighting and other special effects. One spectacular new scene features Batman on the Batbike shooting down a full-size, exploding helicopter.

PROPS (continued): The Stunt Show incorporates exact replicas of costuming and several

high-tech toys that will be seen in the soon-to-be-released movie, along with impressive vehicles such as the redesigned Batmobile and Batbike. Exciting show elements include the evil Mind-Stealing Rig,

Power Tower, Circusmobile and Batmissile Launcher.

ALL-NEW BATMOBILE: The specially designed Batmobile is 8 feet wide and 24 feet long with

a 6-foot fin off the back, weighing over a ton. It is a blind-driver car with special modifications and is equipped with rocket launchers and

pyrotechnics.

STUNTS: The show features approximately one major stunt per minute,

including high falls, dives, karate fights, and trick motorcycle jumps.

All stunts are performed by professional stunt persons.

SOUND: A full score and a variety of sound effects are presented on a

computer-controlled sound system.
